

A \$1.15 million grant from the Federal Transit Administration and ODOT will help Geauga Transit pay for six propane buses that will save 35% on fuel costs and improve the agency's environmental impact and accessibility.

GEAUGA COMMISSIONERS CONTRACT LAKETRAN FOR TRANSIT SERVICE

In July 2023, Laketran assumed the management of Geauga Transit to help grow the rural agency's revenue and expand their fleet to improve services to the residents of Geauga County.

Since taking over the management of Geauga Transit, Laketran has rebranded the agency with a new symbolic maple leaf logo, updated its website, and secured a Federal Transit Administration Low No grant to fund six accessible 12-passenger propane buses and fueling infrastructure.

We are very familiar with FTA and ODOT grant programs, such as the Low No program, because they have funded buses for Laketran. By sharing our expertise with Geauga County, we are bringing more federal investment into northeast Ohio and improving transportation access to local businesses and services. This partnership is a win for the region.




21 BUSES

Geauga Transit operates 21 paratransit vehicles to help improve access to the residents of Geauga County. In 2024, Geauga Transit will be replacing diesel buses with cleaner, American-made, propane-fueled vehicles.
